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FOUNDING PRINCIPLES

Lincoln Christian School was born in the fall of 1997 as a Ministry of Church on the Move. In keeping with the founders' deeply held philosophy of doing all things in steps and easy stages, the school was limited to kindergarten through grade 5. The plan was to add one new grade per year, but the demand for a middle school was so great that the 1998 - '99 school year offered enrollment up to eighth grade. The first graduating class came in May 2003.

From the very beginning, founder Willie George communicated the absolute necessity of a strong bond between parents and school staff. If Lincoln was to be a different kind of school, there had to be a spirit of agreement with all parties. For this reason, Pastor George laid out 3 underlying principles that in descending order would govern the school.

The bedrock principle was a **commitment to Christ-like character**. Lincoln would not be an outreach to troubled youth or the place of last resort for students who have been expelled from other schools. Church on the Move already had a highly successful outreach to youth in 180, which was a national trendsetter in Ministry to teenagers. Lincoln was created as a school for families who wanted to raise their children to follow Christ and demonstrate Christlikeness in the public arena.

Knowing that the teen years are the most difficult season of temptation that any person will ever face, Lincoln put its best communicators in high school Bible classes. Although students are expected to abide by an Honor Code, they also know that mentors are available for their moments of weakness. The passion of our faculty is to lead students to relationship with the real Jesus, which results in the power to demonstrate real life change.

The second foundation stone of LCS is the **pursuit of academic excellence**. Great care is taken to staff the school at all levels with the most qualified teachers. Professional training is an ongoing part of Staff Development. LCS wants teachers who can read kids, not merely deliver a lecture. Lincoln has sent graduates to each of the service academies, numerous Ivy League schools, and the most prestigious universities in the region. Perhaps the most telling statistic in our product is that from 2008 to 2021, LCS graduating classes have received \$58,309,000 in scholarship offers from colleges and universities. This computes to an average award of \$75,524 per graduate.

Finally, Lincoln Christian School is dedicated to helping every student find a **co-curricular pursuit**. Each year, [approximately] 90+% of LCS students participate in a sport or co-curricular activity. Pastor George chose to name the school after our nation's 16th president because of his dogged determination to overcome adversity. The school's mascot, the Bulldog, also reflects this value. Lincoln Christian students are continually pushed outside their comfort zones to achieve what they did not believe they could do. Since its admission to the OSSAA in 2007, LCS has won an incredible 40 State Academic Championships, 20 team State Championships and 14 individual State Championships in various Sports.

At LCS, we are constantly evolving in methods of instruction while stubbornly clinging to old-fashioned values that have made our nation the lighthouse of the world.

We know our mission. We respect our partners. We plan to leave a lasting legacy for generations to come.

PARTNERSHIP EXPECTATIONS

At Lincoln Christian School, we want to raise the next generation of Christian leaders. We prepare **LEADERS** by staying true to our [Founding Principles](#), our [Mission](#), and our [Vision](#). This can only be accomplished through PARTNERSHIP.

God has ordained only two institutions for the training of children: the home (Ephesians 6:1-4) and the church (Matthew 19:14; 28:20; John 21:15). The church and home must cooperate to effectively train your child. The greatest damage we can do to children is to submit them to divided authority. As the Bible says in Amos 3:3, “Can two walk together except they be agreed?”; and I Corinthians 1:10, “Now I beseech you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you; but that ye be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment.”

From the very beginning, founder Willie George communicated the absolute necessity of a strong bond between parents and the school. If Lincoln was to be a different kind of school, there had to be a spirit of agreement with all parties. Lead Pastors Whit and Heather George carry that same vision today.

Our Partnership culture is defined as a mutually supportive, cooperative, and engaging relationship between parents and Lincoln Christian School. At the same time, Lincoln is not led through democracy.

We recognize that while we may take the lead in educating your child in curricular and co-curricular endeavors, you are primarily responsible for your child’s spiritual education and growth as well as the development of your child’s fundamental character. We are allies and partners; however, you are the parents. We respect and assist your role as parents to prayerfully lead, guide, and direct your family in wisdom. As the junior partner, it must be noted that we have many kids from many homes with multiple systems of upbringing. Without systematic clarity, divided authority can be a source of confusion for students and families. As we work together toward molding children who are both academically and spiritually strong, we ask that you remember and commit to the following partnership requirements and expectations of LCS.

Our bedrock principle: A commitment to Christ-like character.

We are committed to helping students develop a faith of their own amidst social and cultural pressure. We are committed to a vibrant partnership with parents by providing resources, support, and community to aid the growth and development of their children. *We are a discipleship school which means your support is required in:*

- Doctrinal Matters
 - Expect us to teach sound Christian doctrine and advance a Christian worldview throughout our academics and activities. *See our COTM Statement of Faith below.*
 - We expect you to uphold and advance our Statement of Faith, Biblical concepts of discipline and moral integrity, and to faithfully attend Church on the Move or another Bible believing church with your child.
 - Disagreements with minor doctrinal issues should not be vocalized publicly.

- Standards of Behavior

- Discipline introduces us to the foundational principle of following Christ: *"If any of you wants to be My follower, you must give up your own way, take up your cross, and follow Me."* (Matthew 16:24 NLT) The word "discipline" is from the Latin word "*disciplina*" meaning "instruction and training." It is derived from the root word "*discere*" - "to learn." Simply put, discipline is to study, learn, train, and apply a system of standards.
- We will not permit students to violate standards of behavior with impunity.
- We will monitor behavior and actions of students and enforce appropriate standards of behavior through non-punitive and punitive actions if necessary.
- We ask you to monitor your child's behavior and assist in enforcing standards of behavior consistent with the LCS Honor Agreement as the primary deliverers of punitive actions for repeated poor choices.

- Relational Questions, Conflict, and Differences

- Appropriate and timely communication is king! We agree to conduct dealings with all in a civil, Christ-like manner. As partners, we agree to deal directly with each other on all LCS related matters.
- ***Please do not seek answers, air frustrations, question policy, actions, or protocol on LCS related matters via social media, venting strife (gossip) to others, vocalizing publicly, or other.*** This erodes trust and destroys relationships.
- In the spirit of Matthew 18, any concerns or criticisms are to be dealt with by involving the appropriate parties directly. This could be school to parent, parent to school, or parent to parent. We will discuss concerns regarding your child with you—not other parents.

- Financial Integrity

- We will operate with fiscal integrity. We expect you to stay current on tuition payments and communicate honestly with the business office regarding the status of payments. You will not be required to participate in fundraising activities or to assume any financial burden relating to the school other than tuition and appropriate activity fees.

The second foundation stone of LCS: the pursuit of academic excellence.

- Culturally, Lincoln is a blend of traditional and developmental educational models seeking to offer an intellectually challenging learning environment. Combinations of standardized, experiential, and project-based methods are experienced daily. Content acquisition in conjunction with critical thinking processes are emphasized. Students are encouraged to think creatively and critically, become problem solvers, and performers. We work diligently to enable students in the discovery and development of their God-given talents and to prepare them for a lifetime of learning, serving and honoring God.
- Academic excellence is often associated with the demonstrated ability to perform, achieve, and/or excel in scholastic activities and our kids do...

- 40 Academic State Titles in 13 years. That's a little over 3 per year.
- Our 2020 Senior ACT average was 23.3 while the National average was 20.9 and Oklahoma average, 19.3.
- At LCS, pursuing academic excellence is combined with the development of intellectual capacities and skills while calling out of gifts and talents in our students and helping them find opportunities to discover, develop, and deploy those gifts and talents in our school, their home church, the Church at large, and the world.
- Lincoln will provide academically rigorous, challenging classes and educational programs and homework will be part of that. Not unreasonable amounts but enough to support the content taught. We expect you to monitor your child's academic performance, assist them as needed.
- A commitment to Christ-like character speaks directly to Academic Integrity. Like you, we aspire to teach kids to do what is right even when it is hard. This includes all forms of academic honesty in the educational setting.

The third foundation stone of LCS: helping students find a co-curricular pursuit.

- By being on a team at LCS, students discover what it means to serve. *"God has given each of you a gift from His great variety of spiritual gifts. Use them well to serve one another."* (1 Peter 4:10 NLT) **The body of Christ is about team.** Shared experiences create lasting bonds.
- 90% +/- participate yearly. Due to some numerical limitations and program efficiency, we must at times, have tryouts where not everyone is selected.
- What we are a part of is greater than the part I play. We finish what we start, we do not quit. We sign a Player Participation form to acknowledge that.
- We will provide competitive and challenging co-curricular programs which advance the values of honor, character, competition, teamwork, work ethic, and performance.
- We expect you to ensure students attend required practices and events, and to comply with rules of the activity with honor, dignity, and class.
- ***It is important that kids experience age appropriate competitive and performance-based opportunities as available. Why?***

- We have a vibrant partnership with parents by providing them with resources, support, and community to aid the growth and development of their children.

- We have a staff team that is healthy, passionate, qualified, and equipped to do the great work we are called to.

- We have an established Endowment fund to secure the financial future of LCS and reduce the financial investment from COTM.

HONOR AGREEMENT

- I will faithfully attend and participate in scheduled services at Church on the Move or a similar Bible-believing church and agree to support the COTM Statement of Faith as it is applied to instruction throughout the curriculum.
- I will pursue the discovery of my God-given gifts and talents, work to develop those fully, and devote them to a lifetime of learning, serving, and honoring God.
- I will strive to observe and grow in the following expectations and tenets of behavior in-person, on and off-campus, through social-media and every other form of communication and relationship.
 - *Respect People*
 - My relationship with myself and others will be based on the principles of Christ's love. I will work purposefully to develop and remain in good relational standing with my parents, fellow students, teachers, coaches, mentors, and others while showing care and concern in my speech and actions. I will speak truthfully, honestly, and will conduct myself in a manner worthy to be followed. I will respect the beliefs and opinions of others and will not seek to degrade or bully. When disagreements arise with others or if I become alienated from others, I will seek restoration and right standing.

 - I will value the development, use, and maintenance of all property and possessions.

 - Collaboration, personal investment, and ownership lead to personal growth. Spiritual, emotional, intellectual, and physical growth are cornerstones of the intention, environment, and culture of LCS.
- I agree to devote my efforts toward sexual purity, as defined biblically, in my actions, conduct, speech, habits, viewing, and interactions with others.
- I agree to refrain from consuming/using, possessing, or providing harmful substances including but not limited to drugs, alcohol, tobacco, e-cigarette/vaping devices and materials. See the Harmful Substances Policy on the Parent's Page of our website.
- I will not violate any OSSAA rules that prohibit recruiting or influencing for athletic purposes and understand that violation of these rules will result in immediate dismissal from LCS. (Do not contact the OSSAA directly. Contact the Athletic Director or Principal)
- I will fulfill my student contracts in all athletic and non-athletic co-curricular activities and understand that failure to honor these commitments may result in immediate dismissal.
- I agree to diligently uphold this Agreement for the full twelve months of the year, at school, at school activities, and outside of school.
- NOTE: Violations of the Honor Agreement, whether on or off campus or during or outside of school hours of school session, will be subject to disciplinary action, which may include suspension or expulsion from LCS. LCS may administer a drug test on any student at any time, at the school's discretion.

STATEMENT OF FAITH

**Students/families are expected to embrace the major doctrines of the LCS Statement of Faith highlighted below.*

• THE SCRIPTURES*

- We believe the Bible is God's Word, the product of holy men of old who spoke and wrote as they were moved by the Holy Spirit. It is accurate, authoritative, and applicable to our everyday lives.
 - (Deuteronomy 4:1-2; Psalm 119:11, 89, 105; Isaiah 40:8, Matthew 22:29; John 5:39, 16:13-15, 17:17; Romans 15:4; 2 Timothy 3:15-17; Hebrews 1:1-2, 4:12; 1 Peter 1:25; 2 Peter 1:21)

• GOD (THE TRINITY) *

- We believe in one eternal God, who is the Creator of all things, and He exists in three co-equal Persons: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. He has existed in relationship with Himself for all eternity. God is totally loving and completely holy.
 - (1 John 5:7; John 1:14, 14:28, 16:28; John 15:26; Deuteronomy 6:4; Isaiah 61:1)
 - **The Father:** We believe in God the Father, an infinite, personal spirit, perfect in love, holiness, justice, and grace. We believe He is all-knowing and all-powerful. We believe He mindfully and mercifully concerns Himself with the lives of humankind; He hears and answers our prayers, and He offers salvation from sin and death through Jesus Christ.
 - (Luke 10:21-22; Matthew 23:9; John 3:16, 6:27; Romans 1:7; 1 Timothy 1:1-2, 2:5-6; 1 Peter 1:3; Revelation 1:6)
 - **Jesus, The Son:** We believe Jesus Christ is the only One who can restore us to God. We believe in His virgin birth, sinless life, miracles, and teachings. We believe the unconscionable beating and violent crucifixion of Jesus was in our place – the full, fitting payment for our sin.
 - (1 John 1:7; Revelation 1:5, 5:9; Colossians 1:20; Romans 3:10-12, 23; 5:9; John 1:29)
 - **The Holy Spirit:** The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity, co-equal with Jesus and the Father in the Godhead. We believe the Holy Spirit, who came forth from the Father and Son, convicts the world of sin and promotes righteousness and judgment. The Holy Spirit is our omnipresent, omnipotent helper, comforter, and guide to all who believe in Jesus.
 - (John 14:16-17, 26; 15:26-27; John 16:9-14; Romans 8:9; 1 Corinthians 3:16, 6:19; Galatians 5:22-26)

• **MAN***

- We believe mankind was made in the image of God. Every human personality is uniquely created, possesses dignity, and is worthy of respect and Christian love.
 - (Genesis 1:26-30, 2:7, 18-22; 3:1-24; Psalm 8:3-6, 51:5; Acts 17:26-31; Romans 1:19-32; Ephesians 2)

• **SIN***

- We believe our sin has separated each of us from God and His purpose for our lives. As a result, man cannot attain a right relationship with God through his own effort.
 - (Genesis 3; Psalm 32:1-5; Isaiah 6:5; Jeremiah 17:5; Romans 3:10, 3:23, 5:12; 1 Corinthians 15:21-22)

• **FORGIVENESS***

- We believe that in order to receive forgiveness from God and new birth, we must repent of our sins, believe in the Lord Jesus Christ, and submit to His will for our lives.
 - (Ephesians 2:8-9; Galatians 2:16, 3:8; Titus 3:5; Romans 10:9-10; Acts 16:31; Hebrews 9:22)

• **SALVATION***

- We are saved by grace through faith in Jesus Christ: His death, burial, and resurrection. Salvation is an unmerited gift from God, not earned by good works or any human effort. Whosoever calls upon Jesus will be saved.
 - (Ephesians 2:8-9; Galatians 2:16, 3:8; Titus 3:5; Romans 10:9-10, 13; Acts 16:31; Hebrews 9:22)

• **THE CHURCH***

- We believe in the power and significance of the Church and the necessity of believers to meet regularly together for fellowship, prayer, and the “breaking of bread.” We believe that God has individually equipped us so that we can successfully achieve His purpose for our lives which is to worship God, fulfill our role in the Church, and serve the community in which we live.
 - (Matthew 16:18-19, 18:15-20; Acts 2:41-47, 5:11-14, 13:1-3, 14:23, 16:5, 20:28; 1 Corinthians 7:17; Ephesians 1:22-23, 2:19-22, 3:10-12, 5:22-32; Colossians 1:18, 3:15; 1 Peter 5:1-4; Revelation 21:2-3)

• **HEAVEN***

- We believe a person’s eternal destination of either Heaven or Hell is determined by their response to the Lord Jesus Christ.
 - (Matthew 5:3, 12, 20, 6:20, 19:21, 25:34; John 17:24; 2 Corinthians 5:1; Hebrews 11:16; 1 Peter 1:4; Hebrews 9:27; Revelation 19:20)

• **HELL***

- Scripture uses words like “everlasting fire,” torment,” and “wrath” to describe Hell. We believe Hell is a literal place. Eternal separation from God happens there.
 - (Matthew 25:41; Mark 9:43-48; Hebrews 9:27; Revelation 14:9-11, 20:12-15, 21:8)

• THE END OF AGE*

- At the ascension the angels said, “This same Jesus will come back in the same way you saw him go into Heaven.”
 - (Acts 1:11)

• RESURRECTION & RAPTURE*

- We believe in the resurrection of the saints and rapture of the Church. 1 Thessalonians 4:16-17 says, “...the dead in Christ will rise first. After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever.”
 - (1 Thessalonians 4:16-17)

• THE REIGN OF CHRIST*

- Following the tribulation, we believe Jesus will physically and visibly return to Earth as King of Kings and Lord of Lords. Revelation 20:6 tells us Jesus’ followers will reign with Him for a thousand years as kings and priests.
 - (Matthew 24:30, 26:63-64; Acts 1:9-11; 1 Thessalonians 4:15-17; 2 Thessalonians 1:7-8; Revelation 1:7)

• WATER BAPTISM

- Baptism in water by immersion is a direct commandment of Jesus and is for believers only. Baptism is an ordinance symbolic of the Christian’s identification with Jesus’ death, burial, and resurrection.
 - (Matthew 28:19; Acts 2:38; Mark 16:16; Acts 8:12, 36-38, 10:47-48; Colossians 2:12)

• BAPTISM IN THE HOLY SPIRIT

- The baptism in the Holy Spirit, as promised by Jesus to all believers, is a gift received subsequent to new birth (salvation). The baptism in the Holy Spirit enables Christ followers to fully utilize public and private spiritual gifts for the furtherance of the Church and for personal spiritual growth. We believe the evidence of the baptism in the Holy Spirit is speaking in tongues.
 - (Joel 2:28-29; Matthew 3:11; Mark 16:17; Acts 1:5, 2:1-4, 17, 38-39; 8:14-17, 10:38, 44-47; 11:15-17, 19:1-6; 1 Corinthians 14)

• SANCTIFICATION

- Salvation makes us righteous before God. Sanctification is the development of Christ’s character in us through an ongoing process of yielding to God’s Word and the Holy Spirit. Hebrews 12:14 tells us that “without holiness no one will see God.”

- (1 Thessalonians 4:3, 5:23; 2 Corinthians 3:18, 6:14-18; 2 Thessalonians 2:1-3; Romans 8:29, 12:1-2; Hebrews 2:11)

- **HEALING**

- Daily health and divine healing were purchased by Jesus' atoning sacrifice. Wisdom for the healthy stewardship of our bodies and divine healing by the laying on of hands are available to every believer.
 - (Psalm 103:2-3; Isaiah 53:5; Matthew 8:16-17; Mark 16:17-18; Acts 8:6-7; James 5:14-16; 1 Corinthians 12:9, 28; Romans 11:29)

EVENT HOST PROGRAM

Throughout the school year, many events occur requiring a team to serve in concessions and gate. Assembling a team of paid workers would be extensive, not cost-effective, and ultimately impact tuition. Working to solve these concerns and put our best foot forward, we have designed the Event Host program. In this program, each custodial parent serves at one event throughout June 30th of the current school year.

PROGRAM SPECIFICS:

- A \$500 per custodial parent fee will be applied to all family accounts at the beginning of the year and removed after fulfilling the requirement. This fee will not exceed \$1,000 per two custodial parent family. Once you have completed your Event Host commitment, the fee will be removed on a per person basis. To avoid the fee, service must be completed before the last day of June.
- For those who cover multiple events, we want to reward you! We have created a program called, "BULLDOG ALL CALL." For every extra volunteer commitment outside of the 1 per custodial parent you fulfill in the school year, we will enter your name into a drawing. At the end of the year, we will give away three \$1000 tuition vouchers for the next school year! For the BULLDOG ALL CALL any parent may serve, including non-custodial stepparents, additional times to be entered into the tuition waiver drawing pool.
- For those who would like to opt out of serving completely, the \$500 fee per custodial parent will be applied to your family account. This fee will be applied at the beginning of the year and must be paid prior to beginning the next school year or before records are released.
- Traditional households or households where the stepparent has obtained legal guardianship implying financial responsibility, a \$500 fee for each custodial parent/guardian will apply.
- In the case of a single parent, with or without a non-custodial stepparent, the fee is \$500.
- A split custody situation with both biological parents in an active role would result in a \$500 per custodial parent fee. If one or both parents are remarried, the non-custodial stepparent(s) would not be required to participate in the program and no fee will be charged for them.
- We have opportunities for each custodial family member to complete their service commitment. Opportunities are scheduled on a first come, first-served basis. Schedule and complete early for the best options.
- Due to the amount of time spent, official LCS Volunteer Youth Coaches are exempt from the Event Host program. Chain crews, clock-keepers, parking lot attendants, etc. are separate from the Event Host requirements but may be considered if equitable time/shifts are completed.

Last minute cancellations and no call, no-shows create issues for everyone.
